


Completing SIP quizzes in the CPD ePortfolio


To access SIPs and complete SIP quizzes, please follow these steps:

- Log into your CPD ePortfolio account and click on **'View all SIP questions'** located on your dashboard:







You might find that some of your completed SIP questions are not relevant to the P&Rs that you have set, in which case you can link them to the Additional P&R that are available by default. Alternatively, you could create a new P&R by clicking on the '**Add new P&R**' tab as displayed above.

If you do not link your Learning Event to your Practice & Role (P&R) you will not be able to save the entry as complete and your CPD credits will not be counted.

- After linking your activity to your P&R, please finalise your Learning Event by clicking on '**Save as completed**'. The system will then allocate the credits to your account.
